SWEET HOUR OF PRAYER

Aahhh-dvent is finally here! This is my favorite time of the year. Advent reminds us that there is always Hope, always Peace, always Joy, always Love in this world. Ad-

vent is about expectation, anticipation—like that song from "West Side Story" that says Something's Coming, Something Great...

But, keeping Advent pure like the snow that comes this time of year can be a daunting task with the inundation of pop culture that tells us to spend more than we can afford on gifts, hosting and attending parties, trying to out-do the Joneses in decorating and displaying. Who can keep up without having their joy overshadowed by the frenzy?

It's also become nearly impossible to separate the story of Jesus' birth from the misconceptions which have worked their way into our traditions, music, and even religious observances.

Let me dispel a few of the misconceptions:

- -Jesus was not likely born in December/midwinter. While the exact date remains unknown, based on when the pregnant Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth, who was six months pregnant with John, he may have been born in mid to late September. Or, going by shepherds being in the field at night, he may have been born in the Spring or the Fall.
- -Jesus was not born in a stable. I am thankful that the New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition (published last year), states the baby was placed in a manger because there was "no place in the guest room". Joseph took his betrothed to his hometown of Bethlehem, to be counted with his family. Note: There is no mention in the Bible of them seeking shelter. An "inn" was a guest room or addition where visitors stayed. People kept their animals in the downstairs of their stone homes in town—not in outbuildings like barns and stables.
- -The Bible does not say how many "wisemen" came from the East. Nor does it say they were kings. Nor does it give their names!
- -The wisemen were NOT at the birth of Jesus. The Gospel according to Matthew reports they visited the CHILD Jesus who was living in a house in Bethlehem. It was their arrival in Jerusalem and making inquiries as to where the king of Jews had been born that spurred Herod's action to murder all male children under the age of two (another clue as to how old Jesus was when they visited).

I encourage you this Advent to take a step back, lock out the glitter and glam, block out the noise of never -ending hoopla, tuck yourself into a comfortable chair, and read the first two chapters of Matthew and Luke. There you will find everything you need to restore Advent to you—the Hope born to the world in the form of a lowly infant: who is Christ the Lord, Emmanuel—God With Us.
